Dear CGSD Family,

I am writing to inform you that a member of our Waynesburg Central High School has been diagnosed with COVID-19. Working with the Department of Health, we have concluded that due to our current social distancing, masking, and sanitizing protocols, there are no other individuals who are considered “close contacts” in this situation. If there is a change to this, we will make sure to notify you. **Please note that this individual has not been in school prior to the confirmation of the diagnosis and will quarantine for the mandated time frame before returning to our schools.**

As the Coronavirus situation in our country and our community is developing quickly, I urge you to take necessary precautions to limit the spread of COVID-19 in our school community.

- Wear a mask and maintain a physical distance of at least 6 feet from any person while outside the home and avoid sharing food, drinks, or utensils.
- Stay home when you are sick. Watch for symptoms of COVID-19 including cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever, chills, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, and/or diarrhea.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol-based hand sanitizers that contain at least 60% alcohol.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue and then dispose of the tissue and clean your hands immediately. If you do not have a tissue, please use your sleeve.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- If you are contacted by the Pennsylvania Department of Health or your local health department please cooperate with monitoring and follow all instructions so that other people do not become sick.

If you or any members of your household develop symptoms of COVID-19 or have symptoms that worsen, notify your local health department or the Pennsylvania Department of Health immediately at 1-877-724-3258, contact a health care provider and your child’s school nurse.
