We are pleased to inform you that **Waynesburg Central Elementary School** will be implementing a new provision known as the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) in the 2022-2023 school year. This program is available to schools and districts that are participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

All enrolled students of **Waynesburg Central Elementary School** are eligible to receive a nutritional breakfast and lunch each school day at **no charge** to your household. Currently this program is only available at the elementary school.

No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without paying a fee or submitting an application.

## Preparing for the 2022-2023 School Year

# Dear Parents,

For the past two years, the USDA has offered waivers to Child Nutrition (CN) Programs across the United States, allowing these programs to offer all students breakfast and lunch at no cost to you. Unfortunately, these waivers will expire on June 30, 2022.

Starting next school year (22-23), CN programs across the nation will return to normal, pre-pandemic operations. Families will once again be asked to complete and submit a current school year Free/Reduced Meal Application if they would like to see if their students qualify based on income. In past years, the first 30 days of the school year carry over status from the previous school year. Since very few meal applications were submitted over the past two years, here is what you can do to ensure your child(s) is ready to start the 22-23 school year:

The USDA's 22-23 meal application are available, and they may be completed in one of two ways:

1. Meal applications can be picked up in any of the school offices. These meal applications need to be completed in entirety and returned to the student's home school office or food service department.
